The conference was focused on inspiring Year six and seven girls to be ambitious for their future and consider careers they perhaps had never thought of, with a focus especially on stem.

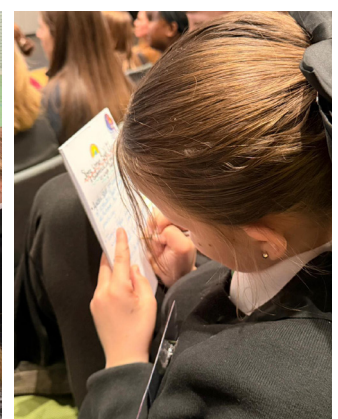
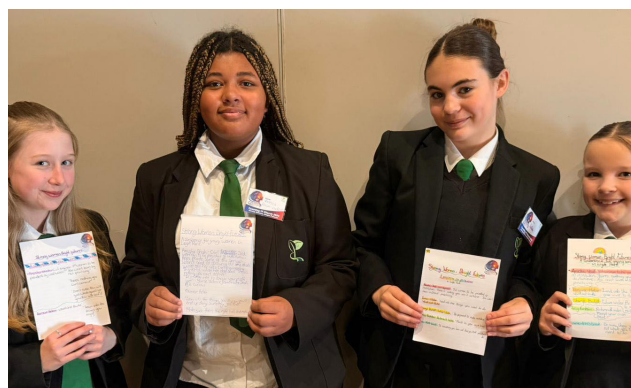
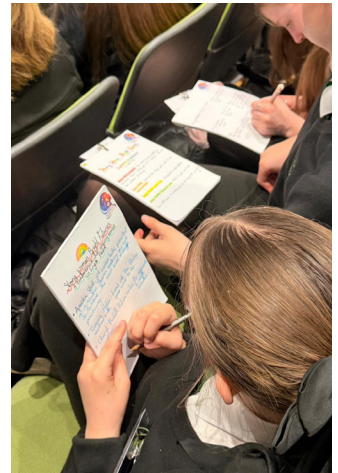
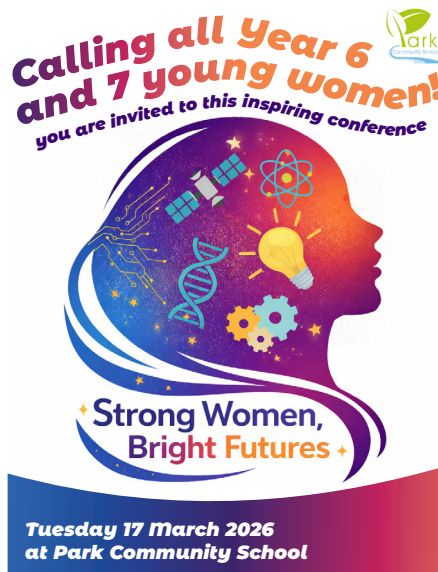
We were delighted to kick off the conference with a keynote speech from Anusha Shah, President of the Institute of Civil Engineering.

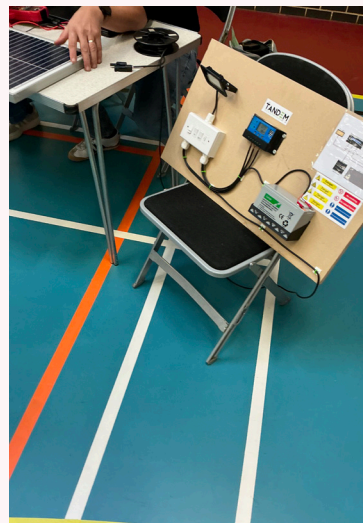

Music Industry Experience Day

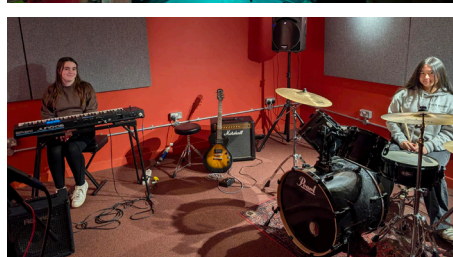
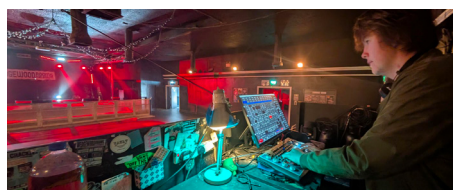
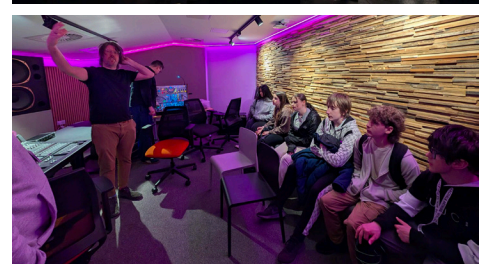
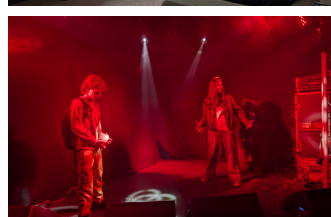
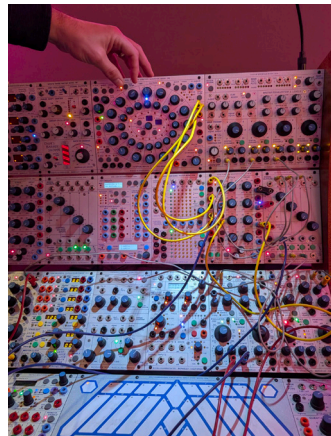
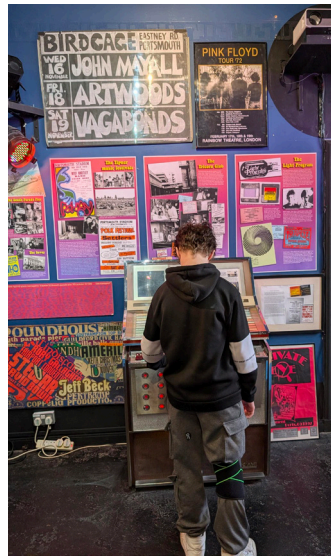
The Year 9 BTEC music trip today was a huge success and provided students with an inspiring day exploring professional music facilities and career pathways within the industry.

We began the day at The Base at Portsmouth Guildhall where students experienced creative workshop spaces and learned about opportunities for all creative artists, young musicians, producers, and performers. We then visited Portsmouth University to tour their state-of-the-art music technology facilities. A highlight of the visit was seeing the impressive £100,000 professional sound desk - the same model used by major artist Snoop Dogg - which gave students a real insight into high-end studio production.

To finish the day, we walked over to the Wedgewood Rooms where students experienced the technical side of a live venue. They explored stage setup, lighting rigs, and discussed organization of a live show with staff, helping them understand how live events are produced and managed behind the scenes. Students also had the opportunity to try the lighting rig themselves, which sparked real interest. Sam even declared he is now a "lighting guy" - a great example of how the visit inspired students to consider different roles within the live music industry. Students were engaged, curious and really enjoyed the experience. The visit provided them with valuable exposure to real-world music environments and helped them better understand the wide range of careers available within the music and creative industries.

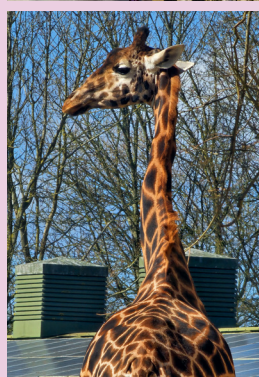

Student Success in GB Boxing

I am delighted to share that a group of our dedicated students at Park Community School have successfully achieved their Preliminary and Standard GB Boxing Awards.

Under the expert guidance of Myself and Mr Coates, students have demonstrated outstanding discipline, commitment, and enthusiasm while developing their boxing skills. Throughout the programme, they have been introduced to key techniques including skipping, warm-ups, and straight punches such as jabs and rear hands. They have also learned how to move effectively in all directions, taken part in partner work, and gained an understanding of the basic rules of boxing.

This award provides a safe, non-contact introduction to boxing, focusing on skill development and fitness. To complete the course, students undertook a practical assessment where they demonstrated their technique and overall proficiency.

Achieving this award is an important milestone, as it prepares students to progress onto the Bronze Award, where they will develop more advanced techniques such as hooks and shadow boxing. In time, this pathway can lead to the Silver and Gold Awards, which introduce controlled contact elements.

In addition to their achievements, students received certificates that can contribute towards recognised qualifications, including GCSEs, BTEC courses, and the Duke of Edinburgh Award.

We would like to extend a huge thank you to Billy Bessey from Leigh Park ABC for providing students with access to a professional training environment. We are incredibly grateful for this support and excited to see how our students continue to progress.

Finally, thank you to Mrs Cavanagh for presenting the students with their well-earned medals and certificates.

We are very proud of all involved and look forward to supporting them as they take the next step towards the Bronze Award!

Science Week

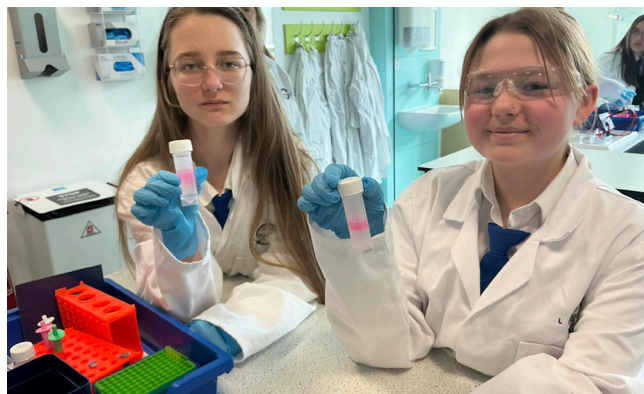
During British Science week our KS3 Science club activities included fun with flame tests, a mini investigation on viscosity and a dramatic demonstration of combustion with the whoosh bottle.
